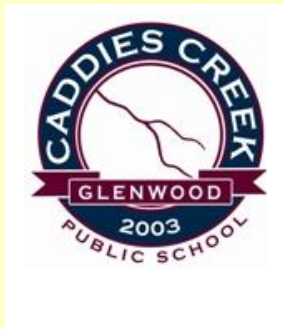
Caddies Creek Public School

Writing With Your Child At Home - K-6

- Read your child’s writing, or have them read it to you and make positive comments about the work – such as ‘I really like the way you’ve described this’.
- Praise your child for attempting to write words that are new to them, and show them how to spell harder words that they may not have spelled correctly.
- Talk to your child about why an author or filmmaker might create a book, play or film in a certain way. What ideas or opinions are presented? What is the author’s purpose?
- Read and talk about the writing that your child brings home from school. Praise them for the things they have done well. For example, writing an interesting story using colourful words, using clear, neat handwriting.
- To develop vocabulary and spelling for writing, play word games like Scrabble, Boggle, ‘I spy’, Scattergories and do crossword puzzles.
