News from the Principal

Dear Parents,

At the end of last week some updated guidelines were sent to schools. Some of the changes in different areas were a little unclear (it wasn't just me who thought so!), so we are awaiting further clarification from the Department on some issues. I don't want to go ahead and announce or do something that is not in compliance; nor do I want to restrict things at Caddies when other schools are relaxing protocols. Situations are different at each school, and principals still need to make decisions based on their site and context.

One of the things that can definitely proceed is P&C meetings on school grounds – and just in time, as the last meeting of the year (1st December) is the AGM. Maximum of thirty (that has never been an issue) and we will ask people to fill out some paperwork on entry. And speaking of the P&C, thank you to them for handing over their second mufti day to Year Six to help with their fundraising for the Year Six Farewell. The mufti day (no theme) will be on Thursday 26th November.

Yesterday was the 11th November, which of course as you know is Remembrance Day. The whole school placed their own coloured poppies out on the front lawn of the school. Year Five put their poppy art work along the administration block walls and they looked beautiful. As close as we could get to 11am with everyone still in their classroom we had a minute's silence, and teachers spoke to their class about the significance of the day. Lest We Forget.

I don't need to tell you how important keeping our children safe online is. We don't have all that many issues with online trolling or bullying at Caddies, but I will tell you that virtually all of the incidences we have had occur outside of school hours. Even though my children are a bit older, I will be the first to admit that I would not be 100% sure of their internet "activity" on a daily basis. Children are getting phones at such young ages now, and it is so important to hear what people in the know think is best advice. Year Six did some online work on the eSafety Commissioner's website earlier this year which was very beneficial. In 2021 they are running a number of parent webinars. The schedule is included later in this Chronicle. They always do quality presentations so they would definitely be worth a look for next year.

Next Wednesday is the OC tests for some Year Four students. This is the test where parents apply online to have their child attend another school in Years Five and Six in specialised advanced classes (our closest school with OC classes is Quakers Hill PS). Usually students sit the test at a neutral venue but this year they will be doing the test at Caddies. It is a pretty tough test - many thousands of students apply across the state and a fairly small proportion get in. As much as we are proud to see students achieve this at Caddies, it makes us a bit sad when these students leave us.

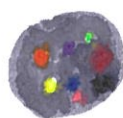

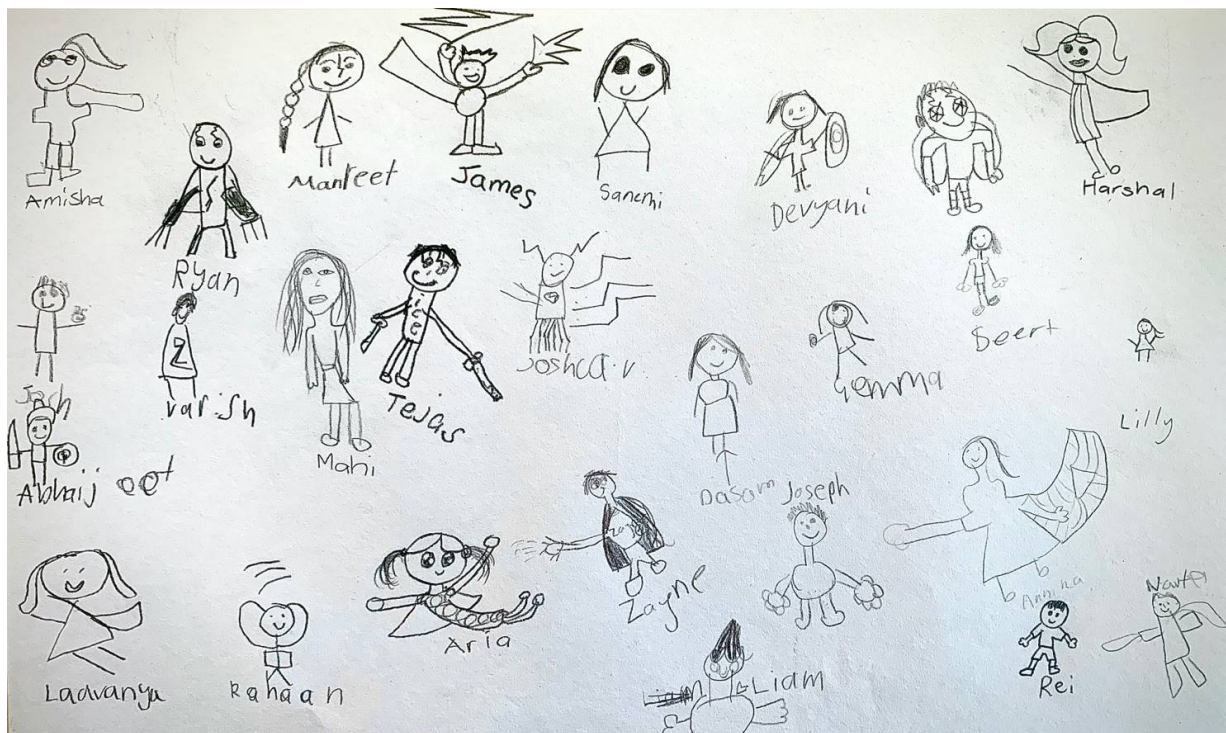
